Born James Augustine Aloysius Joyce on February 2, 1882 in Dublin, Ireland, Joyce was one of the most revered writers of the 20th century, whose landmark book, Ulysses, is often hailed as one of the finest novels ever written. His exploration of language and new literary forms showed not only his genius as a writer but spawned a fresh approach for novelists, one that drew heavily on Joyce's love of the stream-of-consciousness technique and the examination of big events through small happenings in everyday lives.

The day June 16, 1904, was a big one in the romantic life of Leopold Bloom, the protagonist of James Joyces' Ulysses, at least inside his head. In celebration of that day, and Bloom's fictional perambulations around Dublin during the course of it, James Joyce fans mark the date each year as "Bloomsday."

Bill Flynn (91), the namesake of the William J. Flynn Center for Irish Studies at the University of St. Thomas, passed on June 2, 2018, at his home in New York. Bill was a frequent visitor and strong patron of the Center. He opened doors around the world for us in our work to promote peace and reconciliation. He also helped with scholarships and other support for our students. He was a regular guest at our annual Irish Gala and St. Patrick's Day celebrations.

Bill devoted himself to many humanitarian causes, including the Northern Ireland Peace Process. His inspiration for peace in Northern Ireland originated from his Irish heritage. Bill's father came from

Loughinisland, County Down, and his mother came from County Mayo.

The William J. Flynn Center for Irish Studies at the University of St. Thomas in Houston is the only Irish Studies academic program in the Southwest. The Center serves as a focal point for the study and appreciation of Irish and Northern Irish history, literature, politics, law, language, music, art, drama, culture and society. The Center sponsors lectures and cultural events, such as St. Patrick's Day, storytellers and lively concerts. Bill, you will be missed!
