

PAULINE WARD WISHES MOM HAPPY 80TH!

In Celebration of my Mom's 80th Birthday: Culinary Memories from Mayo. Some of my favorite memories from growing up on a farm in County Mayo, Ireland, revolve around food. My Mom was (and still is) an avid baker and is a dab hand at making brown bread, soda bread, scones, apple and rhubarb pies, porter cakes, fruit cakes, sponge cakes, buns and the list goes on! Buns were front and center of every occasion. Trying to recreate those memories for my Son, I have asked Mom to pass on some of her recipes. A simple task, one would think. However, many a phone conversation with Mom on the specifics of a recipe would go something like this. Me: "So Mom, what temperature do I cook these at" Mom: "Oh, a hot oven" Me: "OK, but what exactly is hot?" Mom: "Well you would know, wouldn't you". Well Mom DID know. Everything was intuitive to her, whether it was a pinch of this, a dab of that, a handful of the other, a HOT oven! (In fairness, growing up, we had the old Stanley range which ran on turf and no fancy dials to let you know what the temperature was). But for her not so gifted daughter, a recipe with weights, measures and temperatures WAS required. Mom finally relinquished and broke it down.

Buns: 8 ounces Butter (Kerrygold); 8 ounces Castor Sugar; 4 Eggs; 8 ounce Self-Raising Flour; I teaspoon of Vanilla essence. I. Heat oven to $180^{\circ}C$ ($360^{\circ}F$) 2. Cream butter and sugar with a wooden spoon (don't ask me why, but wooden spoon is better) (or electric mixer) until pale and fluffy. 3. Add one egg, mix until incorporated and then mix in $\sim \frac{1}{4}$ of the flour. 4. Repeat, step 3 above until all the eggs and flour are used up. 5. Add the vanilla essence and mix until incorporated. 6. Bake 15-20 minutes until brown on top.

So as I travel back home this month to celebrate her 80th birthday, I hope I will be welcomed with the smell of hot buns straight out of the oven! Here's to you Mom!
