She graduated from Incarnate Word Academy in 1932. She attended Incarnate Word College & Houston University. She worked for Texaco, and

was the first woman to serve on the board of The Texaco Country Club. In 1947 she married Joseph Robert Imber, they were happily married for 44 years. They were founding members of St. Michael's Catholic Church. Christine was a past President of The Charity Guild of Catholic Women. She was a valued member of the Irish Society and will be missed by all.


